Hope to see YOU at the Lodge.







Once there were 40+ Acres in Hopewell Township . . .

Amid the questions circulating about the Lodge's Special Childrens' Committee versus the Special Childrens' Corporation, it seemed like a good time to do some research and provide some answers.

The Special Childrens' Committee is the same as any other committee within the Lodge. It's resources are supposed to come from either fundraising or budget allowances that may or may not allocated by the Lodge at the beginning of each new Elk year.

We have been very fortunate to also need a Special Childrens' corporation, which is due to funds that were a product of the sale of 42.6 acres of land in Hopewell Township. Prior to the sale, there had been plans to build a Special Childrens school on the property. The land sold for \$360,400 in 2000. The remainder of these funds today are monitored by the corporate officers, who at the moment, are Leading Knight Janet Moskus, and Board of Trustees Chair, Bob Habel. All expenditures from this account must be authorized by both the Lodge's Board of Directors and the Special Childrens' corporate officers. If the corporate officers, as has been done in the recent past, decide to sponsor activities of the committee, such as scholarships to Camp Moore, holiday parties, special events, the committee benefits, as do the children. It is not a requirement that these funds be funneled to the committee. The committee should sponsor fundraisers, as is the case in every other Lodge in the district.

The Special Childrens' corporation is also in existence to hold ownership of the Special Childrens' Park. Costs related to the park are paid from the corporate account. These costs include insurance, lawn maintenance, taxes and donations to Camp Moore or other entities who support children with special needs. During the past couple of years, we have incurred expenses beyond the normal sphere of operation. The park was in dire need of cosmetic landscaping and that was combined with the re-dedication and unveiling of our new sign last year, which had been voted on at a regular member meeting. As many of us experienced in our own homes during this winters' storms, the park was devastated by downed trees and limbs. There was also a loss of trees due to the Emerald Ash Borer. This combination made it imperative that bids be obtained to take down and clean up all the dead/dying trees and fallen limbs. The best bid was accepted and was still a \$20,000 blow to the account. This expenditure was, as usual, presented to and voted on at a regular member meeting. This is the procedure for all funds expended from the corporation.

Anyone having questions on any committee or corporate expenses should feel free to pose them to either of the corporate officers, or at a regular Lodge meeting. Fantasies presented at the bar, or at other outside venues is a violation of our Oath and additionally can't be assumed to be fact by those hearing them. Sometimes stories, rather than being fact, are a camouflage of prior events. Remember to seek facts rather than listen to and spread fiction.
