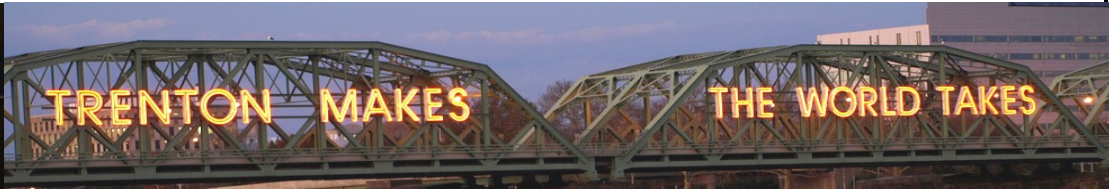

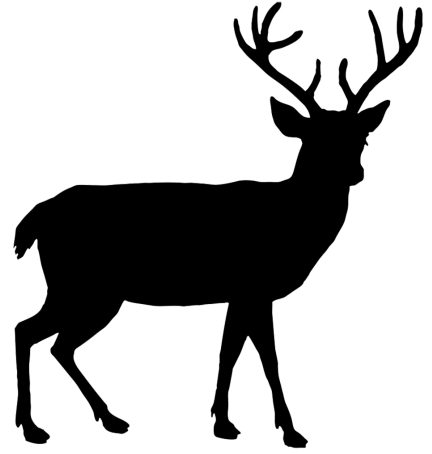


A brief tribute to the majestic elk

An Elk has a reputation for toughness, endurance, loyalty, and... a four-chambered stomach. This of course refers to elk, the largest subspecies of red deer in North America, and not necessarily the Members of this benevolent order. While some people who live out west could easily distinguish a Manitoban elk from a Rocky Mountain elk, many other Members may have never seen one. The Order's namesake is a fascinating creature. Here's what you may not know about elk.



- Elk are endurance runners. They form large groups, known as "gangs," to protect against predators, which include coyotes and bears. Cows (female elk), calves and yearlings live in loose herds, while bulls (male elk) form their own groups or live alone.
- An Elk's antlers can grow an inch a day and become four feet long and 40 lbs. heavy. Elk lose their antlers in March but grow them back in May in advance of the fall breeding season.
- Some cultures regard the elk's antler velvet as an aphrodisiac.
- The North American elk has four living and two extinct subspecies. Other members of the elk family can also be found in Eastern Asia, Argentina, and New Zealand.
- Elk have four-chambered stomachs and can eat 20 lbs. of vegetation a day.
- Elk vary in size, from the Roosevelt elk that can weigh upwards of 1,100 lbs., to the Tule elk, which only can get to around 550 lbs.
- Much like humans, bulls compete and fight with each other for cows. Unlike humans, male elk are known to roll their bodies in their own urine to attract mates.
- Elk attack by charging with their antlers and punching with their front hooves.
- The elk's primary intimidation strategy is bugling, a high-pitch bellow that escalates to a squealing whistle




